

HEALTH POLICY COORDINATOR FAITH BEYOND WALLS/ INTERFAITH PARTNERSHIP

Responsibilities

Under supervision and guidance of the Executive Director or other Director designee, plans, develops, implements, and evaluates health policy programs, social issues and/or other associated activities for Faith Beyond Walls/Interfaith Partnership. A full-time health policy coordinator will be responsible for:

Core Duties

- Development, implementation and management of Missouri Health Care for All including: statewide outreach and communications
- Communicating with congregations, health-care providers, clinics, other non-profit community groups, and government health entities to form partnerships and develop systems to share resources.
- Designing and implementing advocacy initiatives and programs within Interfaith Partnership/Faith Beyond Walls to achieve key organizational objectives.
- Serve as the organizations liaison with key foundation and policymaking bodies associated with health policy.
- Staff the social issues committee. Research and draft position papers in accordance with IP/FBW social policy guidelines and coordinate other efforts and objectives as determined by committee members.
- Researching, writing and managing health advocacy grants to build and support health policy efforts.
- Supervising interns and coordinators as appropriate.
- Connect with and support Abrahams Children and other organizational health programs as necessary.
- Participate in conferences, seminars and other professional development activities to maintain and enhance expertise and professional status.
- Facilitate the development and maintenance of a health and social issues policy resource guide indicating various faith perspectives on issues relevant to IP/FBW and collect faith-based health materials to establish a resource library
- Other duties as determined appropriate and delegated by Executive Director.

- Bachelors in public policy, public health, social work or related field; Masters preferred
- Knowledge of current health policy practices, especially health care reform
- Experience working with faith based organizations or congregations
- Experience with community organizing
- Excellent writing, communication, organizational, research and supervisory skills.

- Ability to work with diverse racial and religious populations
