

Measurement Coordinator (grant position)

The Department of Psychology at the University of South Carolina is looking for a full-time Measurement Coordinator for two National Institutes of Health-funded research studies that are evaluating the efficacy of two different community-based interventions for increasing physical activity levels in underserved adolescents and adults. The projects are testing two novel theoretical approaches to improving physical activity based on motivational and social ecological conceptual principals. The Measurement Coordinator will oversee all aspects of measurement including hiring, training and management of staff. This individual will provide ongoing oversight in collaboration with the investigative team that includes on-site supervision of data collection, recruitment and retention of adolescent and community participants, maintaining fidelity of measurement protocols, maintaining project databases, and implementing quality control measures. This individual must also have basic knowledge of database management and statistical skills.

It is preferable that this individual have a Master's degree in Psychology, Exercise Science, Behavioral Sciences, Public Health, or a related discipline with advanced skills and training in assessment; or a doctorate degree in one of these disciplines. The position *requires* at a minimum a Master's degree and at least two years relevant program experience.
